



Before you know it, summer will be here and our horse camps will be in full swing. We are looking forward to having you as part of our staff this year. I am confident the Lord will provide you with many opportunities to share the gospel, in word and deed, to the campers in your care.

It is our goal to host at least 750 campers this summer and to offer full or partial scholarships to at least 50 of them. These are young people who might not otherwise be able to attend horse camp and experience the Lord through nature, His word and fellowship with other campers and staff members like you.

**I would like to ask you to approach your church and see if they would be willing to partner with you in your ministry this summer by supporting the Marmon Valley Ministries Horse Camp Scholarship Fund.** The cost of one full week of camp for one person is \$600.

We ask all campers to pay at least \$100 of the cost. In a few extreme cases, even this \$100 fee can be included in the scholarship. A donation of any amount from your church would be greatly appreciated and will help change a child's life for eternity. Marmon Valley Ministries is a 501(c)(3) non-profit and donations are tax-deductible.

I have included a link to a sample letter you can use. I encourage you to personalize it by explaining why you chose to partner with us and the blessings you anticipate, for the campers and yourself.

In addition, we have two visual presentations we can send you or your church:
